Loading the entire CD-ROM  
*Words of the Pioneers, Second Edition*  
onto a hard disk operating under Windows  
to run with all files copied to the Hard Drive  
(will require about 180 MB space on hard drive)

If you get an error message on installation (similar to "Incorrect number of bytes written to disk. Source file or destination may be corrupted"), we suggest using one of the follow two methods to copy all files to your hard disk. The set-up program at times is unable to handle the size of the file on the CD-ROM. The data is **not** corrupted. There are two methods of doing this, using Windows desktop or MS-DOS.

## Using Windows Desktop

Assumptions:

1. CD-ROM drive is **Drive D** (if your CD-ROM drive is not **Drive D**, substitute your CD-ROM drive letter below where **Drive D** is listed)
2. Location for APL program is **Drive C** (if your destination drive will not be **Drive C**, substitute your destination drive letter below where **Drive C** is listed)

Steps:

1. On the desktop, double-click "My Computer" icon picture
2. Double-click "**Drive C**" icon
3. Single-click "File" menu at top, select "New" – "Folder" – and re-name (type in) "APL2"
4. Double-click "APL2" folder to open it. (keep this window accessible)
5. Double-click "**Drive D**" (in the window that opened when you double-clicked "My Computer" in step 1)
6. Single-click "View" menu, selection "options" – single-click "Show-All", "Apply", "OK" (this step may not apply under Windows 98)
7. Single-click "Edit" menu, choose "Select-All"
8. Single-click "Edit" menu, choose "Copy"
9. Single-click in APL2 Window
10. Single-click "Edit" menu, choose "Paste" (You should have 60 objects - 168 MB of data)
11. Remove the APL CD from the CD-ROM drive
12. Go to the Start button and choose Run
13. Type: C:\APL2\Setup
14. Choose "Continue"
15. Choose "Run from CD"
16. Make sure you have "Path C:\APL2"
17. Response will be "Successfully Installed"
18. Now access the InfoBase by going to the Start button, Program option, APL, and the InfoBase of choice. (If for some reason, the APL folder of infobases does not show under

the Programs on the Start menu, you can use Windows Explorer to find it, and open it from the folder directly. You may want to create a shortcut and leave it on your desktop. It is assumed you understand these basic Windows functions.)

**Using MS-DOS**

1. Decide where you would like to place the APL collection (which drive). For this example, we will use Drive F. We will assume the CD-ROM drive is Drive H.
2. Go to the DOS shell/Mode (MS-DOS) (should be located under the Start button, and then perhaps under the Programs option).
3. Select Drive F by typing "F:" (without quotes) and hitting the Enter key
4. Create a subdirectory by typing "MKDIR APL2" (without quotes) and hitting the Enter key
5. Change to the subdirectory by typing "CD APL2" (without quotes) and hitting the Enter key
6. XCOPY the contents of the CD disk to this subdirectory and verify, by typing "XCOPY H:\*.\*/V" (without quotes) and hitting the Enter key
7. Exit MS-DOS by typing "EXIT" (without quotes) and hitting the Enter key
8. Remove the APL CD from the CD-ROM drive
9. Go to the Start button and choose Run
10. Type:
  - F:\APL2\Setup
  - Continue
  - Run from CD
  - Path F:\APL2 (please turn over for step #11)
11. Response will be "Successfully Installed"
12. Now access the infobase desired by going to the Start button, Program option, APL, and the infobase of choice.
